DELAWARE STATE SENATE 152nd GENERAL ASSEMBLY

SENATE BILL

AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 29 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATED TO CENTRAL CONTRACTING. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF DELAWARE:

1	Section 1. Amend § 6910, Title 29 of the Delaware Code by making deletions as shown by strike through and
2	insertions as shown by underline as follows:
3	§ 6910. Applicability.
4	(b) Any organization, entity or person designated as the recipient of grant-in-aid shall be entitled to purchase
5	material, nonprofessional services, or professional services under any central contract negotiated by the Section during the
6	fiscal year for which aid is appropriated, provided that all of the following apply:
7	(1) The organization, entity, or person received an appropriation of at least \$100,000.
8	(2) The organization, entity, or person has a staff of at least 5 people.
9	(c) Any bona fide nonprofit organization, entity, or person who is under contract with the State to provide goods or
10	services shall be entitled to purchase materials, nonprofessional services, or professional services under any central contract
11	negotiated by the Section Section, including for health care, vision, or dental insurance, during the fiscal year for which said
12	nonprofit contract is in effect, provided that either of the following apply:
13	(1) The organization, entity, or person is a bona fide § 501(c)(3) [26 U.S.C. § 501(c)(3)] organization under
14	the United States Internal Revenue Code.
15	(2) The organization, entity, or person is a member in good standing of the Delaware Alliance for Nonprofit
16	Advancement or a Delaware registered nonprofit corporation.
17	(f) Notwithstanding subsections (b) or (c) of this section, any organization, entity, or person may purchase health
18	care, vision, or dental insurance under any central contract negotiated by the Section during the fiscal year for which the
19	organization, entity, or person is any of the following:
20	(1) A recipient of an appropriation of grant-in-aid in an amount that is at least \$5,000.
21	(2) A child care provider that accepts Purchase of Care.
22	(3) A recipient of federal pass-through dollars.
